In 1974 I took photographs from the then Footscray Institute Library of that flood. Water was covering the whole area including the Flemington racecourse. (Unfortunately these photographs were lost in the October 2022 flood.)I am no hydrologist but as there was less than 20cm covering our floor, the volume of water held back by the Flemington wall, had it been dissipated over the racecourse I believe, would have saved out property and the forty-seven other properties in our Retirement Village.

I believe the hundred year flood level was reduced by VCAT in 2006 and the proposed Arundel Dam scrapped in 2014 (not sure of those dates) both were contributing factors in the disaster.

Sales people for our village assured us there had been much flood mitigation work carried out (we had seen the Canning Street flood in 1974) but what that was was obviously not sufficient to avoid the October calamity.
